

Rookie Training 2010/11 Season

This proposal is to have a total of eight (8) meetings with four 90-minute classroom sessions and four on court Two Hour sessions in the gym for Second Year and New Officials.

Classroom - Meeting #1: What is an “Excellent Official”, FHSAA/ECBOA Expectations and Requirements to officiate, Registration and Dues, On-line Rules Presentation, Meetings, Rules Test, The Mentoring Program, Evaluations (Self, Mentors and Senior ECBOA members), Uniform Requirements, You and your Mentor.

Classroom - Meeting #2: Review Meeting #1, Two-Man Mechanics, Floor Position and Coverage, Review 38 Hand Signals and Practice Signals, Blow The Whistle.

Classroom - Meeting #3: Review Meeting #2, Handout work sheets with Simplified & Illustrated Rules information on Rule #4.

Classroom - Meeting #4: Review Meeting #3, Provide Test Questions and Casebook examples, Review Test Taking methodology and studying for the test. Review anything covered in the previous meetings and open discussion with questions and answers.

Gym - Meeting #1-A: Two-man Floor Position & Coverage, Whistle Technique, Jump Ball Administration, Throw-in Administration, Free-throw Administration, Reporting Fouls, Time-out Administration and Positioning,

Gym - Meeting #2-B: Review Meeting 1-A, Pre-game Positioning, Coaches Meeting, Table Administration and Discussion, Half Time Procedure, Over-time Administration, End of Game Procedure, Back Court Violations, Free Throw Violations, Closely Guarded Counts and Procedures, Coaches Boxes & Coaches/Team Personnel Location, Leaving the Court Violation, Technical Foul Administration, Intentional Foul administration, Players Disqualification Procedure, End of Game Mechanics & Procedure

Gym - Meeting #3-C: Review Meeting #2-B, Live On Court Officiating Teams.

Gym - Meeting #4-D: Review Meeting #3-D, Live On Court Officiating Teams.

* This last session could be the Atlantic H S Saturday Morning event that we have conducted the past several years.

Other Training Sessions will be conducted on the nights of “General Meetings” with the Training Sessions designed for separate groups of Varsity, JV and New Officials.

My recommendation is that All Second Year and New Officials be Required to attend 7 of the 8 Training Sessions in order to be assigned JV games. I also suggest that the majority of these Training Sessions be conducted on Different Dates than the General Membership meetings. All JV , 150, 160 & 170 Officials will have their own Separate Training Schedule which will be Staffed, Organized & Conducted – TBA.
